history data. I also am gravely concerned that the data will be released to others and/or the public.

6. Permitting the Commission to collect and maintain my personal voter history and party affiliation data undermines my confidence in our electoral and political process.

7. In addition, I fear that collection of voter data, including voting history and party affiliation, will lead to suppression of my vote and the votes of many others in my state. This fear is not unfounded. Commission members have made statements suggesting that voter data that is collected from the states will be cross-checked against data from other federal agencies. This cross-checking exercise could yield misidentification, leading my name to be removed from the voter rolls. This is particularly a risk for me and other voters with minority surnames, especially Latino surnames, that are often overrepresented in cross check-lists.

8. The harm that I am and will experience can only be remedied by an order stopping the Commission from collecting and maintaining party affiliation and voting history data.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing is true and correct.
