(b)(6) is a high-performing artificial intelligence (AI) expert with the Digital Corps Fellowship, assinged to the VA Chief AI Officer team. VA currently has very few AI experts & maintaining this expertise is crucial for VA to be successful in adopting AI to become more efficient & effective at serving Veterans.

(b)(6) is leading VA's Al-assisted software development effort. Thus far, this pilot has demonstrated over 4 hours/week of time savings per survey respondent – resulting in significant VA time & cost savings. (b)(6) is also a data scientist working on a project to decrease Veteran delays in the VA's disability claims process, and has a leadership role in implementing Al management & standards across VA, as required by the new administration in OMB M-25-21 and M-25-22 released April 3, 2025.

(b)(6) is a new mother living in Louisville, Kentucky.
